LEGISLATIVE BRIEFS - A CLOSER LOOK...

SB380: Assisted Suicide: Repeals the current sunset of assisted suicide in CA; shortens from 15 days to 2 days the "cooling off" period before lethal drugs can be prescribed.

SB245: Prohibits deductibles, co-pays, or any other payments by insured for abortion services - in other words, abortions must be free.



A CITIZEN'S GUIDE TO PARTICIPATION

RESOLUTION OF DIFFERENCES:

When agreement is not reached after the second house makes amendments, here is what happens. (Page 10 in the Guide)

Resolution of Differences If a bill is amended in the second house, it must go back to the house of origin for concurrence, which is agreement on the amendments. If agreement cannot be reached, the bill moves to a two house conference committee to resolve differences. Three members of the committee are from the Assembly and three are from the Senate. If a compromise is reached, the conference report is voted upon in both houses.



Governor

If the bill is passed, it goes to the Governor. The Governor has three choices. He or she can sign the bill into law, allow it to become law without his or her signature, or veto it. A governor's veto can be overridden by a two-thirds vote in both houses. Most bills go into effect on January 1 of the next year. Urgency measures take effect immediately upon being signed by the Governor and chaptered by the Secretary of State.
