## Judeo-Christian Caucus - Targeted Bills 2024 - Life, sexuality, family and religious liberty

Bills must be out of their policy committees in their house of origin by May 3 to survive. The fiscal bill deadline is April 26.

May 24 is the last day for bills to pass their house of origin and move to the second house.
