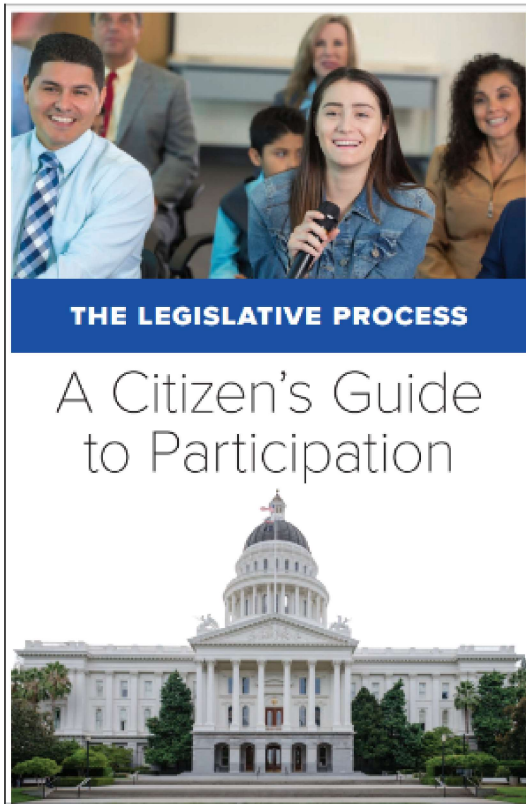

## YOUR CALIFORNIA LEGISLATIVE PROCEDURE:

The California Legislature works in two-year sessions. This is the first year of the current two-year session. That's why you see an AB 1 and SB 1 – the numbering of bills starts over every two years.

While the goal for each legislator is to have the bills move through the process in one year, bills that miss their deadlines in the FIRST year of the two-year session can return at the

house at the beginning of that second year, or they are dead.



**HOW TO ACCESS INFORMATION:**  
(Page 7 in the Guide)

Access to information about your legislator as well as pending legislation is readily available from a number of sources. Your legislator’s district office is an excellent resource. Not only can they provide you with information, but getting to know the staff will establish a relationship that will make you a valuable resource to your legislator.

Information available from your legislator includes:

- Copy of bills pending or passed by the Legislature
- Analyses of bills
- Bill status in the legislative process
- Legislative deadlines for current two-year legislative sessions
- Record of votes in committee and on the Floor
- Veto message for bills vetoed by the Governor
- Legislator’s biography
- Information on items included in the state budget
